

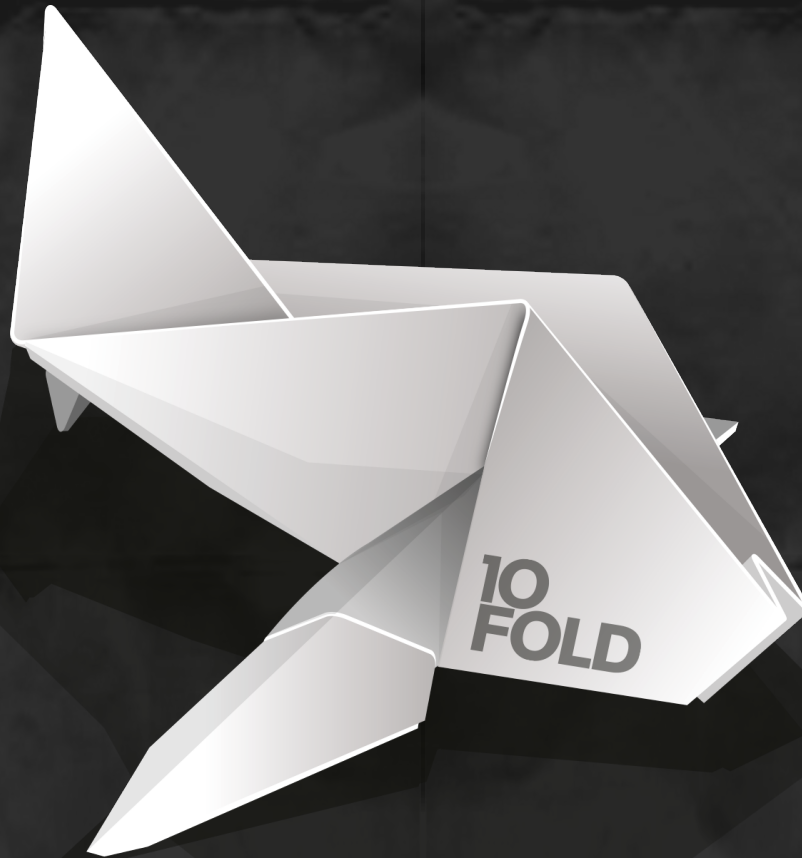

/. ABOUT THE ORIGARMY PROJECT

1 WHAT IS ORIGARMY?

The OrigArmy Project is the creation of Melbourne based Digital Creative Agency 10FOLD.

The idea behind OrigArmy is for creatives to make and share their unique 10 OrigArmy animals by applying their own personal style to each one. It is an opportunity for creatives to showcase their original flair, achieve recognition for their work and develop an online community to inspire ideas around the globe.

2 HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Project will be running for 10 months, beginning on 01 February 2013 through to 15 December 2013. At the beginning of each month, the instructions for each OrigArmy animal will be available for download from www.10FOLD.com.au/OrigArmy

To enter, simply construct your OrigArmy animal, take a photo and post it with your details on the 10FOLD Facebook wall. There will be a monthly winner and an overall annual winner.

3 WHO CAN ENTER?

Anyone can enter - whether you are an illustrator, designer, photographer, OrigArmy-ist, student, school or company. There are no limitations on how you style your OrigArmy animal, it can be a printed photograph, graffiti, wallpaper pattern or even manual style arts and crafts. The choice is yours!

4 HOW DO I ENTER?

- 4a. Download the instructional PDF each month from www.10FOLD.com.au/OrigArmy. Open the PDF in Adobe Illustrator or Photoshop and superimpose your unique design over the top of the diagram.
- 4b. Print off the page trimming the image to the square shape.
- 4c. Follow the OrigArmy instructions in the PDF to construct your animal.
- 4d. Take a photo of your masterpiece. Smart Phone specs are standard.
- 4e. Visit www.Facebook.com/10FoldCreative and post the image accompanied by your full name, location, institute or company and email address on the 10FOLD Facebook page.
- 4f. All entries will be displayed on www.Facebook.com/10FoldCreative page for public viewing and voting.
- 4g. Sign up to the 10FOLD newsletter at www.10FOLD.com.au to receive the announcement of the winners at the end of each month.
- 4h. Winners will be announced on the 5th of each month. Should the 5th fall on a weekend, the winner will be announced on the following business day. Don't forget to 'like' your favourites and share your creation with your friends to help your chances of winning!
- 4i. Return to www.10FOLD.com.au/OrigArmy at the start of each month to download your next OrigArmy challenge.

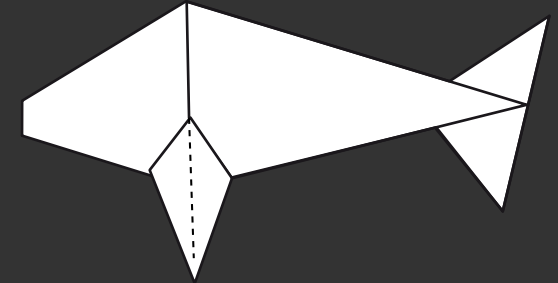

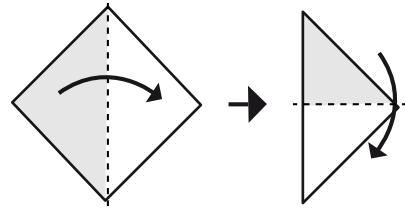
FISH

10 FACTS ABOUT FISH

1. Most fish have taste buds all over their body.
2. Pixar's 'Finding Nemo' was first released May 30, 2003; ten years ago this month.
3. Fish have been on earth 450 million years before dinosaurs even existed.
4. There are more species of fish than mammals, reptiles and birds combined.
5. Although starfish, jellyfish and crayfish have the word 'fish' in their name, they aren't actually fish.
6. A fish can drown in water. Like humans, fish need oxygen, so if there isn't enough oxygen in the water, they will suffocate.
7. Sharks are the only fish that have eyelids.
8. Goldfish can live decades. The oldest known goldfish, 'goldie' died in 2005, aged 45 years.
9. The biggest fish is the whale shark which can grow up to 65 feet long and weigh 40 tons.
10. Most brands of lipsticks contain fish scales.

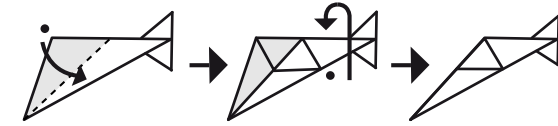

Fold the paper in half on the vertical axis. Then fold in half again on the horizontal axis.



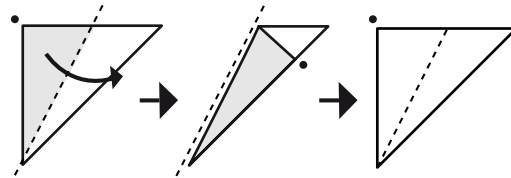
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Fold the dotted corner of the top layer downward to meet the bottom edge of the fish. Flip over and do the same to the other side of the fish.

Fold the dotted corner to the right edge as shown, then unfold.



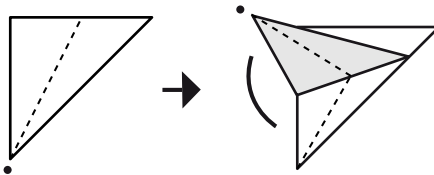

Pull back the dotted corner of the top layer and reverse fold under the top flap. Fold back further for a bigger fin.

Fold the upper layer of the dotted corner diagonally upward as shown. Make sure to leave a portion of the right corner unfolded.*



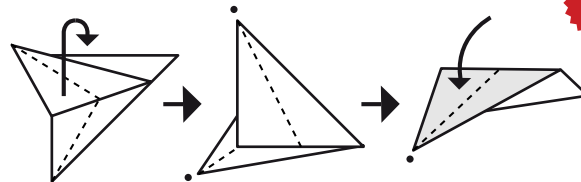

Reverse fold the shaded triangles into the fish head as shown. Repeat on the other side.



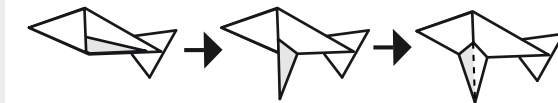
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Flip your fish over as shown; the lower left corner of the triangle should touch the crease in the centre of the flap.** Fold the top triangle down so that the two dotted corners meet.



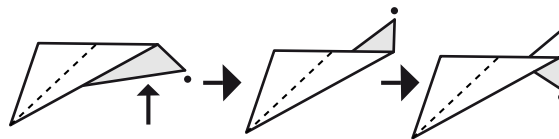
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Fold the shaded area to the left, down along the right edge of the flap. Open and flatten on the crease. Repeat on the other side. Reverse fold the square off the nose.



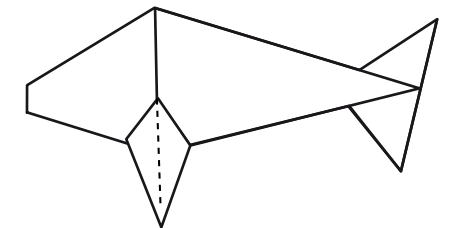
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Open up the figure fish and inside reverse fold the shaded area, then close the figure. The tail has two layers; pull out the inside layer of the dotted corner and reverse fold to reflect the fin above.

*HINT: This step will determine the how large your fish's tail will be. ie. the bigger the unfolded portion is, the larger the tail will be. **HINT: This determines the fish's fin size. i.e. The more you pull this back, the laregert your fins will be.
